First International Day for Biosphere Reserves was celebrated on 3rd November 2022 in Sikkim Professional University, Budang campus. On this occasion, Pro Vice Chancellor Prof. Jaswant Sokhi and Registrar Prof. Ramesh Kumar Rawat addressed the students. The International Day for Biosphere Reserves is celebrated to save the nature and environment and simultaneously to develop it's affection for the same. In India and the world, many national parks and animal sanctuaries are developed in this context. In this connection, many states of India including Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Kerala, Karnataka, Uttarakhand, Meghalaya, Orissa, Madhya Pradesh, Andaman & Nicobar, Chhattisgarh, Sikkim are developing 18 biosphere reserve areas on regular basis. In the world, the 31 African countries developed 86; 14 countries of Arab region developed 35; 40 countries of Asia-Pacific developed 168; 24 countries of Europe and North America developed 306; 22 countries of Latin America and Caribbean developed 132 biosphere reserves on a regular basis.

An event showcasing the contribution of the biosphere reserves to sustainable development was organised at UNESCO Headquarters in collaboration with all the regions of the World Network of Biosphere Reserves.

The Man and the Biosphere (MAB) Programme, was launched in 1971. It is UNESCO's oldest intergovernmental scientific programme. It's 50th anniversary is celebrated in 2021 and 2022. The MAB Programme and the biosphere reserve model have, over the past 50 years, become an international example of sustainable territorial development, highlighting UNESCO's and the MAB's commitment to the global biodiversity agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals.
